

Weekend Camp Checklist

Preparation

- Make sure to sign up on time
- Have a completed copy of the medical form (at least part A and B) on file with the Troop
- Label all items with *Name* and Troop 175
- Trip Plan form completed by the adult in charge if leaving council area or taking part in high adventure

What to Bring To Camp

Pre-Departure

- Medications in a Ziploc bag & label

Clothes

- Class A Uniform including Shirt, Pants/Shorts, Belt & Socks
- 2 troop t-shirts
- 2 pairs of shorts or pants
- An extra outfits
- 3 pairs of underwear
- 4 pairs of socks
- 2 pairs of shoes or hiking boots
- Sandals or shower thongs
- Raingear or poncho
- Hat
- Bandanna

Supplies

- Scout Handbook
- Water bottle or canteen
- Cup
- Mess Kit
- Sunscreen & ChapStick
- Insect repellent
- Whistle
- Small first aid kit
- Compass
- Camera

Toiletries

- Soap
- Shampoo
- Toothbrush & Toothpaste
- Deodorant
- Bath Towel
- Wash Cloth
- Medicated powder
- Foot Powder (if needed)

Camp

- Blankets or sleeping Bag
- Pillow
- Sheet to line your sleeping bag
- Air Mattress or Ground Cloth
- Flashlight with extra batteries (headband style keeps hands free)
- Camp Chair
- Clothes bag (mesh is best but a pillowcase or trash bag will work)

What not to bring

- Radio
- TV
- Butterfly, sheath knives or survival knives
- Golf carts or ATVs
- Bicycle
- Pets
- Firearms, bows, paintball guns or airsoft guns
- Fireworks

Weekend Camp Checklist

Handy Items



Boys can sometimes get a little bit raw. Either from sweating or wearing wet swim clothes or just being hot. Medicated powder is usually available for sale but it is a good idea to send a travel size bottle along.



A small battery powered tent fan can make a big difference over night. There are a number of types and models available. There are hanging, magnetic and tabletop types, all of which can work at camp. Prices vary a lot but affordable fans are available from Walmart, Dick's Sporting Goods and other for between \$15 and \$25.

Tips and Tricks

- † **Uniforms** – Scouts must be in Class A uniforms when traveling to and from camp unless being transported by their own parents. This is so the travel can be covered under the BSA insurance policy.
- † **T-Shirts** – The troop has multiple t-shirts in a variety of colors for the scouts to wear. The adult leaders at camp will tell the boys what color to wear for each day.
- † **Packing** – Your Scout can pack one outfit a day in separate Ziplock bags. This will help keep them dry, fresh and organized. If they force the air out before sealing it also saves space in their bag.
